CHRISTMAS STILL COMES!

Lately we have been hearing a lot about mental health and illness. In Edmonton and Alberta viruses are everywhere, impacting staff attendance, participation in programs, and creating childcare challenges. Friends and other agencies also report people struggling with mental health and most people have someone in their family who is struggling with a mental health issue. We are in a transition time between Covid restrictions and are rebuilding the new

normal. WINGS has also been impacted. Illness seems to spread quickly, and we are concerned about the health of our families. As we morph from the virtual work to face-to-face interactions there is more risk, however there is also more energy and growth for our families. Many plans and supports are quite unpredictable. Is court in person or on Webex? On any given day half of our families are sick. We check in each morning to see who needs support, who has gone to school, who do we expect in our Childcare and our group program. Often, we need to provide our services with staff absent due to illness.

Our families struggle with poverty and financial insecurity. They struggle with medication insecurity. We are so grateful for Connie, our Nurse Practitioner, who provides excellent care and guidance for our families mitigating the need for unnecessary visits to a doctor or emergency room. They have endured much trauma and are leaving family violence. They know that they can't change him, and they have new choices. Somehow, things will be different.

So, what of Christmas? The first gift of Christmas is safety. They are not only safe but have support and are not alone here. They have hope of new possibilities. There will still be grief around the dream of a happy family. They navigate court applications for protection orders and parenting orders. They don't need to do it alone. They have advocates at WINGS and with expertise in domestic violence.

The children are asking a lot of questions and at times are confused about their 'new house'. But they are happy and laughing and just being kids! It is so good! The children paint a Christmas mural, do crafts, have treats, get to be Elves for Mom and have pizza. The children are assured that Santa does know where they are and that he comes every year to WINGS! They love the decorations in our common areas and get to decorate in their apartment. The staff support them in intense safety planning for Christmas break. WINGS has always worked to provide a safe and fun Holiday season. We respect the diversity in both culture and faith traditions. Not everyone celebrates Christmas, but everyone does celebrate feeling loved and finding joy. The Moms feel they are a success if their children receive gifts, have food and a safe place to live. Maybe even with new pajamas!

This is a new beginning, and it is your generosity that makes the healing and providing both basic needs and special celebrations a reality. Thank you for your compassion and giving spirit.

WINTER UPDATE FROM RFDC & OSC



The Rocky Forest Daycare and Out of School Care is in our 7th year of providing quality childcare for the families of WINGS, Home Next Door and outreach families that have moved on to their journey of independence. We continue to provide trauma informed care for our children and mothers utilizing the program, by being sensitive to effects of domestic violence on parenting and their children. We prioritize building relationships as this is the foundation of us providing the individual care the family requires and deserves.

The program is holistic in our approach in that we support all aspects of the child's care. Diapers and wipes are provided for younger children and extra clothes from donations for older children. We also encourage healthy eating

and incorporate different cultures, such as curry, perogies, and nachos—along with an emphasize on fresh fruit and vegetables. With rising food costs, we are appreciative of the donations that we receive to provide these opportunities.

Our Early Childhood Educators are working on becoming familiar with FLIGHT curriculum framework and supporting the interests of the children through emergent curriculum. We are co-learners and co-researchers on expanding the child's interest and making them mighty citizens of their world.

In the spring we are excited to have the 1st phase of our new playground construction start! We are all very excited! The generous donations of the community have made this possible, we are hopeful for donations to

complete the 2nd phase soon.

CHILD AND YOUTH UPDATE

Our group programs are crucial in helping our children and teens to connect and heal from family violence. November was Family Violence Prevention Month, but at WINGS every month is family violence prevention. Our goal is to provide the children and their moms with a safe place to share their feelings, promote building friendships & connections with others, and education on skills to assist with breaking the cycle of violence.



This fall, we continued with our children and teen group programs while following safety guidelines. In a recent kids group, some of the children shared about fighting at home and how they now feel safe living at WINGS. One teen added that she feels so relieved that her family came to live at WINGS as her and her mother's relationship has only grown stronger through their healing process.

As we move into the Christmas season, we are excited to offer safe and fun activities that create a sense of community and belonging for our kids. In November, our staff turn into 'Christmas Elves' and magically transform both of our buildings for Christmas. The children become so excited when they see all of the decorations! Our kids join in on spreading Christmas cheer by painting a beautiful Christmas Mural, sprinkling on TONS of glitter! In December, our kids make festive Christmas crafts, and also pick out beautiful gifts for their moms at our Kids Are Elves event. And of course, the kids will receive a special delivery of Christmas gifts from Santa (and our wonderful donors!).

Some of the holiday plans that we have scheduled for the teens this Christmas season include decorating the Home Next Door Youth Room and putting up a Christmas tree, along with building delicious Gingerbread houses, and going on an outing to Glow Edmonton light festival at the Expo Centre! Every Christmas season the teens also receive personalized gifts that are just for them from



our amazing donors; these gifts lift their spirits sky high each and every time. Many teens that live at WINGS and HND have never experienced a Christmas quite like this, and it's extraordinary to see their gratitude and pure happiness shine through the holiday season.

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
