Rocky Forest Daycare

Rocky Forest Daycare and Out of School Care is in our 8th year of providing trauma informed care for families at WINGS, Home Next Door and Outreach clients. We continue to support mothers and their children as a preventative program to break the cycle of abuse. By creating an atmosphere of respect and caring, moms feel comfortable to ask for parenting strategies when there are challenges and are happy to celebrate their successes with us. The children learn their strength in their heart and soul by expressing themselves through play and learning social & problem-solving skills, while having fun with their friends and receiving guidance from Educators.

We continue our FLIGHT framework curriculum journey with support from our partner through ARQE (Alberta Resources and Quality Enhancement). Educators enrich their skills by upgrading their professional knowledge in childcare through courses offered by a variety of community agencies, Family Wellness Initiative, Grant MacEwan University and ARQE.

Our first phase of the new playground is complete! The children have been enjoying hours of fun - using those big muscles through gross motor play, creativity through imagination, and the pure joy of climbing and sliding.







The second phase - an Appollo - is a version of a merry go round, and once funds are raised, we will be reaching out to Blue Imp to complete our secure play area.

Accurate Network Services volunteered their time and paid for paint to freshen up the RFDC & OSC. They also added a new garden plot in the playground area and the bulbs are planted for the spring.

It is through your donations that we are able to offer trained professional Early Childhood Educators who create trauma informed activities to enrich the lives of children at the most important age of their development; delicious snack options that are culturally sensitive and healthy to feed those growing brains and bodies; and a warm, comfortable space where children can feel safe and secure.

From the Fund Development Team!

We are so appreciative of the support from our amazing community this past year - it has had a profound impact on the families at WINGS. Thank you for not only believing in the lifesaving work being done at WINGS, but also for standing up and surrounding our families with your love and support.

Some highlights from this past year include:

 Early in the year, there were a number of third-party events that kindly fundraised for WINGS - including a Lord of the Wings concert, Funnies for Families comedy night, a concert put on by Montreal-based artist Mekel, and a Square Dancing night by Double Diamond Dancing - all in support of WINGS.

- In the Spring our lovely Mother's Day Tea returned to inperson, and was held at a new location in Stony Plain - we had a record number of guests (300!) and had a fantastic day celebrating moms and raising funds for WINGS! Our NEW Rocky Forest Daycare Playground was opened this spring too (with help from some generous donors), and the kids have absolutely loved climbing and playing on the new equipment! We also had a number of amazing volunteers come out to support WINGS by helping at our Casino this spring - thank you!
- In the Summer, we really felt the love of the community at WINGS! The Run for Kelli campaign, which was organized by a group of supporters in honour and memory of their friend Kelli, ran a marathon together and raised \$10,000 for WINGS. We also had a big Tie-Dye Day for the families at WINGS and Home Next Door, and the Millwoods Community Church were gracious enough to come volunteer to barbecue and serve everyone lunch. There were also 2 Golf Tournaments held in support of WINGS Edmonton Employee Benefits Association, and Advocis Edmonton. And at the end of the Summer, Accurate Network Services came with 50 of their employees and spend a Saturday painting our hallways, daycare spaces and more!
- In the Fall, we launched our Build a Backpack program and received many backpacks filled with new school supplies for the children! We also kicked off our WINGMAN campaign, and had 15 WINGMEN take a stand against domestic violence and help raise over \$20,000 in support of WINGS. In October, WINGS was chosen by 16 local Shoppers Drug Mart stores as the recipient charity of their #GivingShelter campaign. In November, WINGS supporters bid on our Make-Believe Ball Online Auction and bought raffle tickets too (for the WestJet Flight Voucher!) all for a good cause of course! Our Special Events Committee also won a National Philanthropy Day award in November too!

Unfortunately, we don't have space to include all of our amazing supporters - but please know that we are so appreciative to everyone for helping to make brighter futures for the families at WINGS!
